EPISCOPAL ORDINATION OF MOST REVEREND ROMEO D. CONVOCAR, DD

The Diocese of Chalan Kanoa joyfully welcomed Most Reverend Romeo D. Convocar, DD as its 3rd Bishop in a solemn and historic Episcopal Ordination ceremony. The ordination was graced by distinguished guests, including Governor Arnold I. Palacios, Lt. Governor David M. Apatang, Senate President Dennis C. Mendiola, Speaker Edmund S. Villagomez, and Guam Governor Lou Leon Guerrero, along with esteemed bishops from the Episcopal Conference of the Pacific and the Philippines. Among them were the new Apostolic Nuncio to Aotear, New Zealand, Archbishop Gabor Pinter; Archbishop of Manila, Jose Advincula; and Archbishop of Agana, Ryan Jimenez, all witnessing this profound moment of spiritual leadership.

CNMI STAKEHOLDERS MEETING: CNMI LEADERS DISCUSS MILITARY PROJECTS AND INFRASTRUCTURE DEVELOPMENTS

Governor Arnold I. Palacios, Lt. Governor David M. Apatang, and CNMI officials met with Rear Admiral Gregory Hoffman, Commander of Joint Task Force Micronesia, to discuss ongoing and upcoming military projects in the region. Rear Admiral Brent DeVore, Commander of Joint Region Marianas, was also in attendance. Topics included updates on the Tinian Divert Airfield, airport and road infrastructure improvements, and private sector engagement in military initiatives. The meeting, part of CNMI's ongoing collaboration with the U.S. Department of Defense, was attended by legislative leaders, mayors, and members of the Governor's Cabinet.





SAIPAN MARATHON 2025: A GLOBAL GATHERING OF RUNNERS

The Saipan Marathon 2025 saw 591 runners from around the world. The event began with the Full Marathon at 4:00 a.m. (135 runners), followed by the Half Marathon at 5:00 a.m. (116 runners), the 10K Marathon at 6:00 a.m. (205 runners), and the 5K Marathon at 6:15 a.m. (135 runners).

Runners from Korea (208), CNMI (125), USA (84), China (75), Japan (46), Philippines (16), and Poland (5) contributed to this global event, further solidifying the Saipan Marathon as a key athletic highlight in the region.



COTA LAUNCHES FEASIBILITY STUDY FOR INTER-ISLAND FERRY SERVICE

COTA has launched a feasibility study, funded by an FTA grant, to assess a sustainable inter-island ferry service connecting Saipan, Tinian, Rota, and Guam, with possible expansion to the Northern Islands. Over seven to nine months, the study will evaluate financial and operational feasibility, economic impact, and environmental sustainability. **Community input is encouraged, ensuring transparency and stakeholder involvement.**
